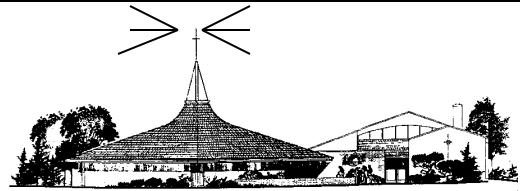

New Year's Message FROM THE PASTOR

The day of Epiphany is January 6, the first day after the twelfth day of Christmas (did you get your twelve drummers drumming?) Epiphany celebrates the coming of the magi. According to Matthew, who is the only one to tell this story, the magi enter the house where “they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage.” Jesus receives three gifts and the magi return to their own country.

In the days between Epiphany and the next immediate Sunday, Jesus does a lot of growing. The first Sunday after Epiphany is known, liturgically, as the Baptism of the Lord. Not the presentation of Jesus in the temple about which Luke tells us, but a grown-up Jesus being baptized by John in the river Jordan.

Each of the gospels has a story to tell about John, but only Matthew, Mark, and Luke tell of Jesus’ baptism. No doubt the idea of Jesus’ baptism was problematic. Given that baptism is for repentance and forgiveness of sins, why would Jesus need that? Luke and Matthew have already told us that Jesus is born of the Holy Spirit, and John solves the problem by omitting Jesus’ baptism altogether. Only Mark remains as a bit of a mystery, as Mark tells us no birth narrative. In Mark’s story it begins with John proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins and Jesus is right there to go under. When he arises, the Spirit descends upon him, and he hears the voice of God say that God is pleased with him.

Jesus’ baptism, celebrated on the second Sunday in January, is an intriguing thing biblically. Not so much with us, however, as we are part of the crowd that needs a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sin or, at least, a renunciation of sin as the modern liturgy prompts us.

In the Presbyterian church, baptism is closely related to our ordination to office. The three offices of the church—Elder, Deacon, and Minister of Word and Sacrament—each acknowledge baptism in the ordination ceremony. This year we have 5 Elders and 7 Deacons whom you have elected who will be installed on January 9, the Baptism of the Lord. As part of that installation service is a reaffirmation of baptism by the congregation. As our Directory of Worship puts it, “In Baptism, each Christian is called to ministry in Christ’s name...In the lives of believers and in congregational life there are special occasions of awakening, renewal, and commitment [which] are appropriately celebrated through the reaffirmation of the baptismal covenant.”

It is always a special day when we stop to acknowledge those called to particular service in the church. This year I invite everyone to be in worship on January 9 so that we might all reaffirm the promises made at our own baptism, remembering that in our Baptism, we have been set free from sin, marked as Christ’s own, and sealed by the Holy Spirit.
